LESSON 1

- Also known as the Islamic State or ISIS, formed after U.S. troops withdrew from Iraq in 2011
- · Targeted religious enemies and committed brutal public executions
- · Caused refugees to flee ISIL-controlled areas in large numbers
- Forced over 1 million Iragi citizens to leave their homes, according to UN estimates
- Began attacks outside of Iraq and Syria in 2015
- Downed a Russian passenger jet, conducted deadly attacks in Beirut and Lebanon, and claimed responsibility for a deadly attack in Paris

Global Health Pandemics

- International interactions help infectious diseases easily spread.
- 1.2 million people died from AIDS-related illnesses in 2015
- More than 2/3 of the 37 million cases of HIV come from Africa, which has been devastated by the disease.
- Global AIDS deaths have declined due to the availability of antiretroviral therapy.

THE EURO

The common currency used by members of the European Union (EU)

Adopted by 12 EU nations in 1999



Had officially replaced 16 national currencies in 2010

Serves over 330 million people

Second largest reserve currency after the U.S. dollar
